Snippet from COLP – drains

Incidentally any floods in the roads that last less than 24 hours do not merit attention from DCC. Oh and Exmouth Town Council will be returning to the Town Hall!

Green Corridors for Exmouth

Following Anne-Marie's talk at July's 29-minutes, Noel has been motivated to suggest a project, ensuring Green Corridors through Exmouth's new housing estates:

'The Exmouth area of East Devon has been long renowned as a place of outstanding natural beauty and a rich habitat for wildlife in flora and fauna. As the built environment is developed here, it is essential that these qualities are not lost. They could be enhanced with careful planning. There are already recommendations that green corridors are incorporated into the Neighbourhood Plan.

...The project could include mapping the location of existing fruit and nut trees in public places and in land privately owned if the owners are interested, assisting linkages between existing trees and shrubs and new planting in corridors such as cycle and footpaths, and park roads.'

Noel has limited mobility so is anyone able to help him in this?

Glenorchy Church

Noel tells me that his efforts to help Glenorchy Church turn Green have born fruit. Despite falling and breaking his shoulder at their 1st meeting, Noel has persevered with the Eco Action Group and now the Church has reached the stage of getting a Bronze Award, which allows it to be listed as an ECO Church. Well done.

To explain why these Christians should take ecology to their hearts, I am indebted to Martin Goss, who writes:

"Taking God seriously is to take the environment seriously. To live in sustainable harmony and in just relationships with the created order is at the heart of a Gospel which affirms abundant life for all.

At their last meeting they expressed interest in some joint activity with us. Two activities are now on the agenda. One is to encourage members to try to measure their eco footprint. Another is to reconsider having solar panels on the roof. Anyone want to get involved?
