1. Lynne's part 2 '29-minutes' at Green Drinks Tomorrow

Lynne Wycherley's presentation last month was very well received but of course her resume of what each of her heroes had to say at Ecology & Resergence's 50th anniversery event was left unfinished in the 29 minutes to which our presenters are restricted. She got through half of her stories however and I've invited her back this month to complete the series. The planning she puts into her talks is impressive and her innovative props are not to be missed!!

2. Where are we with Wayne and the Seafront?

Over the latter part of this year, I've been reporting on our (Sustainable Exmouth's) involvement with the future of Exmouth's much-loved Seafront. Our mission has not changed: we are not for or against development but we do want to ensure that anything built there is Eco-positive. With that in mind, we have made no 'treaty' with Save Exmouth Seafront, nor with any developer although we have talked with many people.

Against the background of entrenched positions, tenant evictions, legal action, and demolitions, the introduction that I made back in the summer of designer Wayne Hemingway to EDDC, may yet bear some fruit! I saw then that an external input might just clear the log-jam and open a way for a productive dialogue that was otherwise unlikely to happen. See:

As I see it, EDDC are determined that nothing should stop Grenadier from putting in a detailed application for a Watersports Centre as Phase 2; they are not going to allow anything to get in the way of that or the road realignment necessary to facilitate it. Phase 3, the site that Moirai were interested in, they are treating differently and seem to be preparing a flexible approach so as far as that goes, I think the Town's protests have worked.

I can only quote from public positions as reported in the Journal, but in their edition of 24th November an EDDC spokesperson is quoted as saying: "*Phase three will be the subject of a future visioning and consultation exercise that is independent of Developers*". So is Hemingway involved or not? The culture of secrecy holds sway!

As for the recent seafront march, organised by SES, although Transition Exmouth did not put in an official appearance, I lent SES the 'David Ireson' megaphone and some of our banners/placards, which were over-written with slogans much in the spirit of my my July/August newsletter: "There is an unanswerable argument now for all to unite behind the call for an independent consultation before EDDC go out to tender again".

SES spokesperson Louise MacAllister wrote afterwards:

"Thank you for helping to make the seafront march a success, we have had excellent coverage in local media and across social networks, this is something EDDC cannot ignore."

Let us hope that some reconciliation can be achieved between the warring parties, even at this late stage.

3. Christmas Cycle Ride
