raising of locally collected seed in community tree nurseries, to the of planting six thousand saplings a year. Creating new woodland benefits not only biodiversity and climate, but also allows volunteers to engage with a positive environmental project and connect with nature.

Election Day - tomorrow

Voting for Town & District Councillors takes place tomorrow. Time to read all those leaflets that have come through the door and to vote for the candidates who seem to have their fingers on the local issues that matter to us.

Wild Exmouth

In its first few months, the Wild Exmouth project has already had three Conservation Volunteering days, two at the 'Hillcrest Community Nature Reserve' site (the woodland area around the St John's Road playing fields and Withycombe Brook) and the planting of a sensory patch with herbs 'for people and pollinators' at the Bapton Park green-space (between Nutbrook and Bapton Lane) as well as a 'Bee Bumble' on The Maer.

Debs Ryland tells us that her conservation days run, as a rule, on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month but not on 2nd May.

She will be carrying out some wildflower enhancement later this month and is about to go live with their Big Exmouth Hedgehog Survey – participants will be able to use one of their mammal track tunnels for a week to survey their garden /allotment or other outdoor space for hedgehog (and hopefully other mammal) use.

The sampling table also gives those new to veganism a chance to try meat and dairy alternatives and see which ones they like before they go shopping. Last but not least, the market is great for catching up with friends over a delicious lunch from regular caterer Fairfoods or our other guest caterers. All proceeds from teas and coffees and all profits from stallholder fees go to EFFA campaigns and other animal causes.'
